### PASTOR GRETCHEN TO DEPART; SESSION BEGINS INTERIM SEARCH

After many months of prayerful discernment, Pastor Gretchen has submitted her resignation to the Session (see her monthly letter on page 2).

The Session has begun first steps toward finding an interim pastor to begin when Pastor Gretchen departs in October.

Her final Sunday with us will be October 13. More details will follow regarding our final time together.

In the meantime, the Session is already working closely with Executive Presbyter Ken Meunier to move quickly to call an interim pastor who can begin serving with us soon after Gretchen leaves.

Here are the steps for the next few months:

- 1) June 19 – Ken requested Committee on Ministry (COM) leadership for a COM representative to be assigned to the Lodi Session
- 2) June 23 - Announcement during worship to the congregation
- 3) Session has begun work on filling the pulpit for Sundays beginning October 20.
- 4) June 24 - Ken has begun searching for possible interim candidates for the Session to consider

- 5) July 16 - Ken and COM representative will meet with Session to complete a job description and compensation package
- 6) August 1 - Ken will report Session's acceptance of Pastor Gretchen's resignation to COM at their August 1 meeting for their minutes (no meeting in July)
- 7) Late – August (estimate) – interviews will begin
- 8) Mid – September (hopefully) – Interim will be named
- 9) Interim will hopefully begin shortly after Gretchen's last Sunday (October 13)

I suspect that my resignation (front page of this newsletter and announced during worship on June 23) may have taken many of you by surprise. Since I'll be serving you through Sunday, October 13, we'll have lots of time to talk and think about all of this, but there are a few things I want to share with you right now.

First, I want to commend to you the leaders, the Session, of this congregation. The current Session is composed of Greg Manning, Sandy DeSelle, Marcia Brown, Paul Ammann, Rick VanFossen, Beanie Ludlum, Dawn Salzman, and Dorothy Richards. Perhaps one of the great sadnesses for me in the midst of my decision is having to leave this particular group of visionary leaders. They have been completely and totally supportive of me, have expressed deep regret at my leaving, have shed tears with me, and have led you all through some of the the most difficult and trying situations in the past year that this church could only imagine, and they have done it with grace, with prayers, with discernment, with vision, and, probably, without most of you knowing that there was anything difficult or trying going on at all.

By the time I leave in October, I will have been with the Lodi Church for almost eight years. When I was called by the session to serve you, it was a time of distressing chaos. The session at that time had already noodled through some of the things they wanted us to accomplish together. And in my first few months with you I sorted through some issues that I knew we had to address in order for the congregation to move forward toward Christ's call.

There is still a lot of work to do. This church family has grown as a family – one of the challenges I identified – but you can all be a lot closer. Yet everything on my personal/professional "to do" list with you has been either accomplished or is on the way toward accomplishment. There remains one major hurdle with which the session has spent months wrestling and praying about but which, I suspect, will be nearly overcome by the time I leave. I am convinced, however, that what God called me to do here will either be done when I leave or in process. Therefore, it will be time for you as a congregation and with an interim pastor to take the next steps toward becoming a healthy congregation that reflects not the community around you, but the love of Christ for you.

I didn't make this decision overnight. It has been difficult for me as I have tried to listen and watch for the leading of the Holy Spirit. I would say that it has been about 18 months in the making.

I have long believed that a pastor should not stay with any church longer than eight to ten years. Now that's purely my opinion and I am in a minority among my colleagues in believing that. But my rationale and experience and, I believe, wisdom, have all instructed me that long-term pastorates tend toward complacency. And what I know, for certain, is that our congregation here in Lodi cannot sustain complacency. As much as many of you do not like change, change in this congregation has to be almost constant in order to keep all of you on your toes, constantly seeking God's call and direction for you whether that is in worship or in service.

To answer one of your questions immediately: I do not know what is in store for me. I intend to take a sabbatical period (length to be determined, but at least through the end of the year) to listen and watch for God's direction. I will tell you that it is an unnerving time for me, but since God called me to ministry in the first place, I have had many unnerving times when I have just had to be quiet and listen for that still, small voice, that whisper (as Elijah heard in 1 Kings 19:12) from God directing me to whatever God has in mind for me next. And I find, in spite of being unnerved, complete solace in resting in God's comforting presence. Being called by God and doing God's ministry, whether ordained or not, is always, always an unnerving experience.

What you will do, I pray, will be much the same. Listen for God's still, small voice, God's whisper to you as a church family.

I need to wrap this up for this month, but let me quickly add that according to the wisdom of church policies and traditions, when a pastor leaves a congregation, we have to completely break our ties with one another. That will allow you to bond with your new minister(s) without my influencing presence. That means I can't come back for weddings, funerals, baptisms, or other church celebrations or observances. So if you want me to be present for any of those things, you need to get it planned to happen before October 13 (but don't die!). 😊 That gives us about 14 weeks!

And here are the verses I intend to call my own for my remaining time with you (from 1 Timothy 4:1-8), and unbeknownst to you, during the entire time I have been with you:

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: <sup>2</sup> proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. <sup>3</sup> For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, <sup>4</sup> and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. <sup>5</sup> As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

<sup>6</sup> As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. <sup>7</sup> I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. <sup>8</sup> From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing.

So be it. Amen.

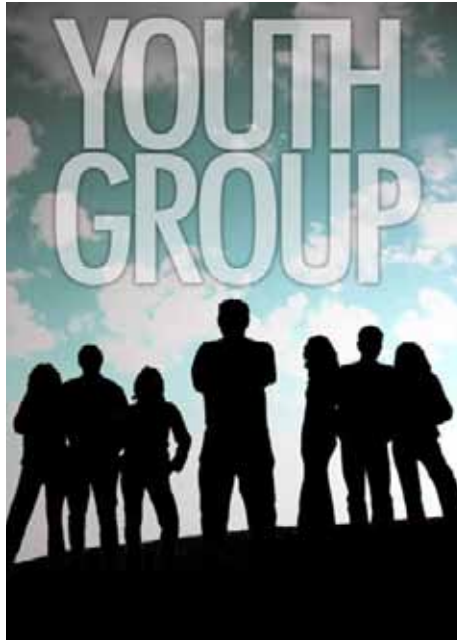

# WHAT IS INTINCTION?

The simple answer comes from Merriam-Webster: the administration of the sacrament of Communion by dipping bread in wine and giving both together to the communicant. The practice has been common in Roman Catholic churches through the centuries when only the priest was allowed to drink the wine. Wikipedia tells us this concerning Protestants:

“... intinction is common in some Anglican Churches, which often give the communicant the choice of drinking from the chalice or receiving by intinction. In many Presbyterian, Lutheran, Episcopal, and Methodist churches the communicant, not the minister, dips the host in the chalice. This is the practice in some Baptist and Congregational Churches as well, often using grape juice in place of wine.”

For the summer we are using the Intinction method of communion. If you are unable to walk up for communion we will come to you. Thank you for trying something new.
