UPDATE ON PASTORAL TRANSITIONS

The Session of our church wants to keep the congregation up to date as much as possible as we make the transition from Pastor Gretchen to an interim pastor. You can look at last month's newsletter for the first announcement and initial plans, along with Pastor Gretchen's statement about her departure. The newsletter can be found on the church website: www.lodipresbyterianchurch.org. Click on Newsletters and then page down to July 2013. This current newsletter will also be posted there.

First of all, the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry has appointed The Rev. Nancy Enderle as moderator of Session after Pastor Gretchen leaves. Rev. Enderle is from Madison and is

not currently serving a church.

Executive Presbyter Ken Meunier has led the Session through the steps to calling an Interim Pastor. A CIF (church information form) needs to be submitted and Session members have provided their input to Rev. Meunier so he can get that information compiled. This form will be forwarded to John Knox Presbytery and the General Assembly (national church) for matching with available interim candidates. A list of potential candidates will be sent back and forwarded to Session for review.

From that, the Session may invite someone(s) for interviews, and, hopefully, initial interviews can be done via Skype in order to save the costs of travel for potential candidates.

The timeline on this, if everything goes smoothly, calls for the interim pastor to start November 1 (Pastor Gretchen's last date in our pulpit will be October 13). The Rev. Enderle will fill the pulpit on October 20. A determination for pulpit supply for October 27 will be announced when that work is done.

"Christianity is a religion based on faith and the Session has faith it will be able to find an interim pastor who will fit our needs," the Session said in statement.

Rev. Meunier will be in the pulpit on September 22 and will make himself available during fellowship time to answer questions anyone may have.

Please be in prayer for the Session, Rev. Enderle, Rev. Meunier, the Committee on Ministry and the candidate who will be called to serve our church.

August 2013

I read recently a quotation attributed to the late comedian George Carlin. It was among some serious observations Carlin made later in life. This particular sentence stood out for me: "We talk too much, love too seldom, and hate too often."

One of the hurdles to becoming a healthy church that I observed when I joined you as your pastor over seven years ago could be summarized in Carlin's statement. There was a lot of talk about how close you were as a congregation, but I was amazed at the amount of gossip, malicious gossip, that seemed to run rampant through the church. The more I got to know Lodi, the more I understood that what was happening in the church was just a reflection of the community. It's one thing to spread a rumor – that happens in all small towns – and it even happens in cities like Madison. It's something else altogether when folks will hear a really malicious piece of information about someone they would otherwise consider to be a friend or acquaintance or a church family member and then go ahead and pass that malicious rumor on without going to the person who is without doubt going to be hurt by it – going to that person to find out if, indeed there was any truth at all to what was being passed around.

One of the things the session did and brought to you all for your approval early in 2007 was develop a policy statement to help set a tone for how to handle rumors in the church, especially regarding treatment of staff. That policy is based on Matthew 18:15-17, 20:

If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.

Unfortunately, we have not been successful as a church family in observing this piece of scripture or others related to it such as Matthew 7:1-5:

Do not judge, so that you may not be judged. For with the judgment you make you will be judged, and the measure you give will be the measure you get. Why do you see the speck in your neighbor's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye? Or how can you say to your neighbor, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' while the log is in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your neighbor's eye.

This continues to happen among a very small handful of people in our church, but the damage they are doing is great and deep and tearing this congregation apart. You should not stand for it.

As you look to the future with an interim pastor, I strongly suggest that you begin serious discussions about how to put an end to this kind of behavior. For, as Jesus also said, "Love your neighbor as yourself." When we spread malicious lies about people, we must not love ourselves very much at all. And that makes Jesus sad.



AUG 2013 YOUTH MINISTRY UPDATE



Hello fellow Christ-Lovers!

June was quite an exciting month for the youth of our church. After all the planning and luggage arranging Mission Trip was finally happening. There were seven kids and three adults that loaded up and ventured down to Belleville, IL. It was a week full of hard work, hot weather, awesome music, and great fellowship. I was so impressed by the spiritual growth that happened within that week. I was able to watch the kids grow closer to God through music and the messages that were shared throughout the week. Since most people had attended the worship service that followed, I won't share everything but there were a few stories that, as a youth director, stood out.

First story was the quilt that was given to the gas station attendant. Over the week the eight different worksites stopped at the same gas

station to pick up ice for the coolers. Each day the same lady works behind the counter. She was honestly one of the nicest people I have ever met. On Wednesday morning we were informed that the gas station had been broken into. Since this was the sixth time since starting her position the attendant was afraid her job was in jeopardy. On Friday each worksite crew has their own quilt to give to their residents. But because of lack of a resident. Crew 3. which included Jordan Bauer and Mae Stocks, decided to give their quilt to the nice lady at the gas station. I don't believe I have ever seen somebody's face light up so much in my life. She was so grateful and happy that she was recognized. The crew took a picture with her and her boss was standing there and she expressed how proud she was to have an amazing employee.

The second story completely took my breath away. During the service the Sunday after returning, the kids share their personal stories of camp. All the stories were inspirational but one really stuck out to me. Felicia O'Rell is probably one of the guietest at youth group. But camp brought her out of her shell. She was not afraid to get up in front of our congregation and tell her story. She grabbed that microphone like she owned it. During her testimony she expressed her indecision with the idea of Christianity and following God. She told us that camp had changed her whole perspective on her faith. She was finding herself accepting the idea of one God and Jesus' sacrifice for us. By the end of her little speech, I bet there wasn't a dry eye in the room. Her final words still bring chills to my body, "HERE I AM GOD, I'M RIGHT HERE." To have one of the youth that I have spent just over a year with commit themselves to God, makes everything worth it.

I am so happy to see that God has found his way into the hearts of new believers but has continued to work in the hearts of all those to attended camp this year.
