Be the body of Christ so that others will look at you – for even a few moments – and know that you carry the joy of the Lord with you.

In the "low German" of my ancestors from the Frisian Islands off the coast of northern Germany: *Grusse Gott*; Go with God. Never doubt God's love for you and God's love for your enemies. And take heed of all of the angels unaware that drift into and out of your lives at every moment of every day.



A lot of change has come about for our youth. They are going through the process of losing an incredible pastor. I have heard them talk about the things that Pastor Gretchen has done for them. She has been some of their confirmation teacher, she has been their role model, and she has been the rock for some of them. She is an important part in their lives.

I know that change can be hard for them because I have seen it firsthand. The night that I let the kids know of the changes that were going to happen, I can remember Keith and Kira's first question "are we still going to have a lock in before you leave?" It still makes me giggle a little. I know that they know I will be out of their lives but they are still looking forward to all of the things we can do before I leave.

With that said, I plan on doing a bunch of fun stuff before I depart from our beautiful church. If I have just one hope, it would be that the congregation of our church doesn't forget about the importance of those teens and young adults. They are incredible kids that deserve to have that place where they can feel safe and they can turn to in their time of need. What better place for them to turn to than a place filled with the love and acceptance of Jesus Christ, our Savior. I pray that our youth program stays strong because those kids deserve the best.

PIG ROAST 2013 RE-CAP

Once again our annual Community Pig Roast was a win-win situation on all counts. It was a very, very warm September night, but with lots of help we served a delicious meal to about 230 folks from our community. We got lots of compliments on how good the food was as well as the plentiful portions. Many stayed around and enjoyed the wonderful music of Karen Wickham. Thank you so much, Karen. Your talents really add to this event.

The silent auction also provided lots of great items on which to bid. The story this year was the hand-carved duck (maybe Susie herself) and the bidding war that ensued between members of our congregation. The "winner" finally took it home, but not until she wrote a check for \$140! Thank you to all of you who donated items and to those who purchased them.

Our youth and Cassy had a fun time with the Cake Walk and Becky McIntyre and Shane served up some nice fresh popcorn.

The wonderful part about our Pig Roast is the way we make ourselves visible in the community and offer a super meal for free or whatever donation folks want to give. It's about sharing hospitality with those we know and with total strangers of whom there were quite a few.

Some huge thank yous go out to the Tritts for providing the big tent and putting it up. To the Richards for the straw bales. To Ron Nelson for arranging for the tables and two other large tents. To Jean Mulcahy for making her great potato salad. To Dar Wenger for the baked beans. To all our youth who ran up and down the stairs a million times with food and supplies. To the anonymous donors who paid for the pig and all the grocery items and paper products. And to all those who worked to set up, serve, and clean up. Many hands made the job so much easier.

The proceeds for all parts of the event (and the sale of leftovers) amounted to approximately \$2,550. \$150 was earned by the youth in their Cake Walk. \$1,400 will go into

the operating fund, and \$500 each will be given to two deserving mission causes: Hope House in Baraboo which helps victims of domestic violence and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance which helps victims of natural disasters such as the recent flooding in Colorado.

SCRIP UPDATE

As of September 15, 2013 the SCRIP program has earned \$1,515 for our church operating budget. Thank you to all of you who are participating in the program especially those of you who are new to the program. It is easy and painless once you get into the habit, and it really benefits the church.
